Ross, a Rector and a River

In the middle of the Eighteenth Century a Rector of Ross, one John Edgerton, started inviting his wealthy friends and relatives to Ross, put them onto boats and thereby initiated the first recorded package tour, travelling down the river to Monmouth and beyond. This idea was soon taken up by William Gilpin who published a book on the "Wye Tour" (one of the first ever tour guides).

Schools in the Wye Valley Learning Network have been working on a project to document this in the form of videos that will eventually be made available to visitors, via smart phones and QR codes placed in strategic tourist spots.

A film premiere of their work takes place in St Mary's Church on Friday 2nd May at 7.30 pm. Admission is free and we look forward to seeing you there.


A huge well done to our debating team from Year 5 who came 2nd in the WVLN Debating Competition last week. Everyone was very proud of you all.


