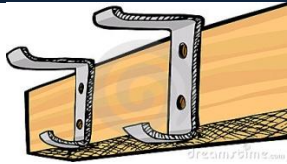

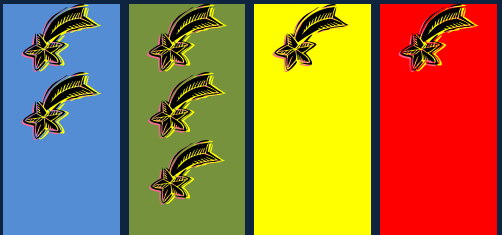

A message from West Mercia Police

There is a 'safe festival' personal safety campaign being carried out by West Mercia Police and partners in Herefordshire from the 16th to the 27th of Dec (Excluding Christmas day and Boxing day). Each day has a particular focus and we will be using local newspapers, radio and social media to promulgate the daily key message.

We are particularly keen to bring to your attention one key message which we are using in a competition aimed at primary school children. We will have 5 POLICE BEARS in 5 shop windows in Hereford City Centre, all of which will have part of an internet safety message. The 5 stores are WILKINSON's, The ENTERTAINER, Hunky Dorey -Church street, Marks and Spencer's and Phillip Morris & Co, entry forms in the stores.
