Dear Parents and Friends,

First, a big thank you to Mrs Chambers and Mrs Burton for their help in the Forest Schools ventures, this last week.

We are considering following the practice of some of our partner schools and producing your children's annual reports in the Spring half term, instead of the Summer. If you have a view on this, one way or the other, please do send us an e-mail, through <u>admin@goodrich.hereford.sch.uk</u> and we will take your views into account. You would, of course, still receive a record of end of year attainment in the Summer parent interviews, and any statutory "end of key-stage" testing would still be reported in writing. The theory behind spring term reports is that it gives you time with the same teacher to deal with any concerns or issues before your child might move class. You would still be able to track a year's progress but this would become Spring to Spring. Year Six reports will remain in The Summer term.

You may be aware, from conversations with your child, that we have produced a whole school code of behaviour (as in the photograph). This has been produced with the children, largely through the older juniors, then in consultation with the younger children, and finally moderated by the staff. This includes a three tier sanction system for unacceptable behaviours. A copy of this will be incorporated into our behaviour policy soon, ratified by the governors and then available soon on the website or from the office. Of course, at the heart of our ethos, is the positive reinforcement of good behaviours, and on that note, a hearty well done to Peregrines Class for their outstanding behaviour at the Blake Theatre event at the Monmouth Haberdashers' School.
