



Sports Premium Funding 2017-18

At Goodrich Church of England Primary School we have split the funding into three key areas for consideration: Physical Education, Healthy Active Lifestyles and Competitive Sports.

On 24th October 2017, The DfE released an update on the PE and Sport Premium for this academic year.

As well as identifying who is eligible it covers:

- The amount
- What the money should and should not be spent on
- Accountability measures

The amount

All eligible schools will receive £16,000 + £10 per pupil (number will be based on the January 2017 school census)

GOODRICH = £16,000 + £1,360 (136 pupils x £10)= £17,360

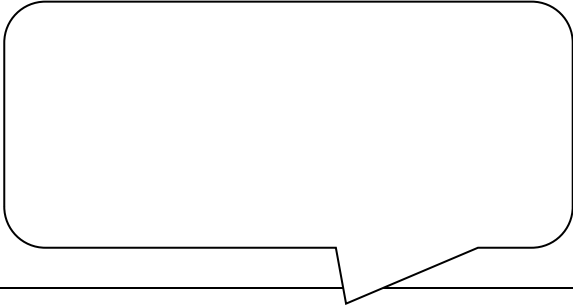
