

<b>Goldcrests</b>	In Goldcrests we have been talking about Autumn fruits and colours. We listened to the story 'Rufus and the Blackberry Monster' and then went for a lovely walk to the church to pick blackberries. Back at nursery we made apple and blackberry crumbles, learning how to use a knife safely to cut our apples. Looking at shape and colour, we have been using our observational skills to paint some amazing still life fruit pictures. We have been practising counting and number recognition by making apples out of playdough, adding the corresponding amount to the numbered apple trees. We have also learnt how to make orange, both by combining red and yellow playdough and by getting our hands dirty mixing red and yellow paint in the tough tray, great fun!

In Maths we have been revisiting number bonds to 10 then to 20, the children have been using beanbags and hoops, part whole models and tens frames to help them remember all the ways, we have been quizzing the children so that they are able to quickly recall the bonds! In Science the children have been exploring the question- 'do bigger seeds grow bigger plants?' We had a class discussion and the children came up with some ideas of how we could find out and answer the question. The children decided if they planted a big seed and a small seed they could see if they grow into big and small plant. The children have been eagerly awaiting shoots to grow.
