


I did not envy Mrs Blake having to judge the winners from each class.


As with any book day the costumes also lifted everyone's spirits. Thank you for all the efforts at home.




<p>With the start of spring upon us Goldcrests have this week been looking at the life cycle of a butterfly. Watching with interest the whole process of the caterpillar's transformation, building a cocoon and turning into a butterfly. To explore the topic the children have been creating playdough butterflies, using number lines to create the body of a caterpillar and using their creative skills drawing and painting to make their own symmetrical butterflies. The children have loved becoming involved in creating 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar' wall display, linked to one of their favourite stories, which not only looks at the life cycle but days of the week, counting and a discussion on healthy eating. The children have also been busy this week creating story scenarios in the role-play and small world areas around the fire service and emergency vehicles.</p>
