

Class News

Last week Goldcrests learnt all about hibernation and Remembrance Day. We had fun at Forest School, making a hedgehog house and 3D hedgehogs from natural resources. Back at nursery, we enjoyed making hedgehogs from playdough, practising our scissors skills to snip the dough to make the spines. Playing in The Three Bears house, we used lots of language from the Goldilocks book to recreate the story. At the end of the week, we watched the CBeebies Remembrance film and learnt about why we wear poppies. We then painted some beautiful poppy pictures.

This week we are talking about our senses. We have used our sense of smell to try to discover what was in the smelly pots, our sense of touch to work out what was in the feely bags and our sense of hearing to play listening games. We have explored different textures, both in a textured collage and in our sensory tub, learning lots of new words. We also made pizzas for snack and listened to the story The Gingerbread Man, before making our own gingerbread men to take home, yum!
