December is the high season for candle fires. Christmas trees and holiday lighting add to the fire risk during the holidays.



1. Use heavy-duty, outdoor extension cords for exterior holiday lighting.
2. Display a fresh Christmas tree, dry trees are bigger fire hazards.
3. Use a timer or turn off holiday lighting before going to bed.
4. Never leave candles unattended or near flammable decorations.

We hope that everyone gets to share Christmas with someone, be healthy and look after the world for future generations, (Woodpeckers)

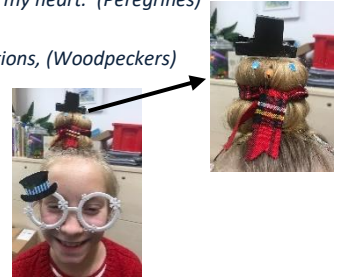
We ask that everyone has fun times with their families and friends. (Wrens)

Wishing you a Christmas filled with joy, love and peace of the heart and mind.





Class News

On Thursday 9th December, Peregrine Class went to meet an author (Ian young) and whilst sitting round a lit fire-pit and drinking hot apple and black currant juice, he read some of his story called The Winterscar Chronicles: 1 Cry of the Norwolf and then did a question and answer session. It was a great experience.

In English, we have continued to write our stories and in History we have been researching information about the weapons used and the impact that the Second World War had on society then and now.
