10 INTERNET SAFETY TIPS FOR PARENTS

- 1 Don't block all access to technology. Help your child learn to use tech **safely and positively**.
- 2 Take an **interest** in your child's favourite apps or sites. Co-view or co-create at times.
- 3 Be the parent. You're in charge. Set **boundaries** and consider using filtering software.
- 4 Create a family media **agreement** with tech free zones such as cars, bedrooms, and meals.
- 5 Teach your child what **personal information** they should not reveal online (YAPPY acronym).
- 6 Help your child learn to **filter** information online and navigate fact from fiction.
- 7 Navigate digital **dilemmas** with your child. Avoid using devices as rewards or punishments.
- 8 **Balance** green time and screen time at home. Focus on basic developmental needs.
- 9 Don't support your child to sign up for sites with **age restrictions** (e.g. 15+) if they're underage.
- 10 **Learn more**. Explore reliable resources for parents so you can educate yourself.

I hope you enjoy your bank holiday weekend.



Class News

The children have come back to Nursery full of their Easter stories and how they enjoyed their chocolate from the Easter Bunny. Reflecting on this we looked back at photos taken on our wonderful day when we linked with Wrens, Robins and Peregrines. Meeting up with siblings and also finding new buddies in Peregrines who arranged a fabulous windmill hunt where we explored the school grounds in more detail.

This week we have been busy in our new sweet shop, where we have been developing our maths skills to weigh and cost out the price of the last of the Easter eggs on the shelf. Finding some eggs still quite expensive at £100. The sand area has been very busy, changing daily from a snake pit to an area where the children have been practising their skills using tools to transfer it into test tubes, measuring jugs etc. We have been discussing volume and whether things are full, half full or empty. (More of this to come.) Forest school this Wednesday was full of chatter as children used their descriptive knowledge to describe the things around them, exploring something as basic as a stick, using size and texture language. Thinking of ideas about where they came from and what we could use them for. Some of the ideas were really well thought out- a rolling pin, a bridge, a pen, a walking stick and even a v shaped stick as a door way.


