Starting the week off with Forest School, the children worked together to create dens, talking with each other, sharing their ideas, using physical skills and learning how to secure their tarpaulins. Congratulations to the children who have learnt the skill of tying knots. The children have enjoyed dressing up and showing their dancing techniques, building story scenarios around diggers in the sand and looking at dinosaurs and how they are now extinct. Well done Flora and Daisy who shared this knowledge. We have also been using dominoes to explore matching numerals and pictures, dinosaur shape games and counting and matching using counting dinosaurs. Practising our hand writing with our pencil control sheets and writing our names. 

Robins	<p>In English we started off by talking about the Queens Jubilee and the children wrote some brilliant questions that they wanted to ask the Queen. We then learnt all about adverbs and began writing sentences about how animals move using words such as sneakily, speedily and slowly. In maths the Year 1s have been using money, making amounts, buying items in a shop and solving word problems using money. Year 2s have been working hard on their quick recall of multiplication facts. In Art we have started our new theme 'dreams and nightmares', the children have been learning all about William Blake and how he used an outline and silhouette before he began to paint. In PE the children have been playing invasion games, where it is 2 versus 1 in game situations, which they have really enjoyed. Tim Berners-Lee has been the topic of discussion in History and the children have been finding out about how he changed the world with his invention of the 'world wide web'. As part of our science we started off our awe and wonder theme by predicting what would happen to raisins when you put them into water and lemonade. Woodpeckers	<p>In Maths this week, we have been using our knowledge of tenths to convert them to decimals and understand the value of each digit, to show on a place value grid. We have also used our knowledge of tenths to order and compare tenths as fractions and decimals and divide 1-digit and 2-digit numbers by ten. Year 4s also looked at using this knowledge and applying it to hundredths. We have also been practising telling the time on an analogue clock, focusing on five-minute intervals and to the nearest minute. In English, we have been looking at the features of a newspaper report to plan and write our own and have also been looking at the different types of prepositions, identifying them in sentences and using them to describe where objects are in pictures. In Art, we have started our new theme, 'The Renaissance'. We explored different artwork and sculptures from famous artists from this era and used different patterns to create our own Renaissance pattern. In PE, we have been working on our batting, throwing and fielding skills through Rounders and swimming with Mrs Jones. In R.E. we have been discussing how life is like a journey and what different events are milestones in religions. In Science, we have been exploring habitats to identify and classify different invertebrates and in Computing, we have been looking at different tools that can be used to edit photos.</p>				Last Week
