




Dear all,

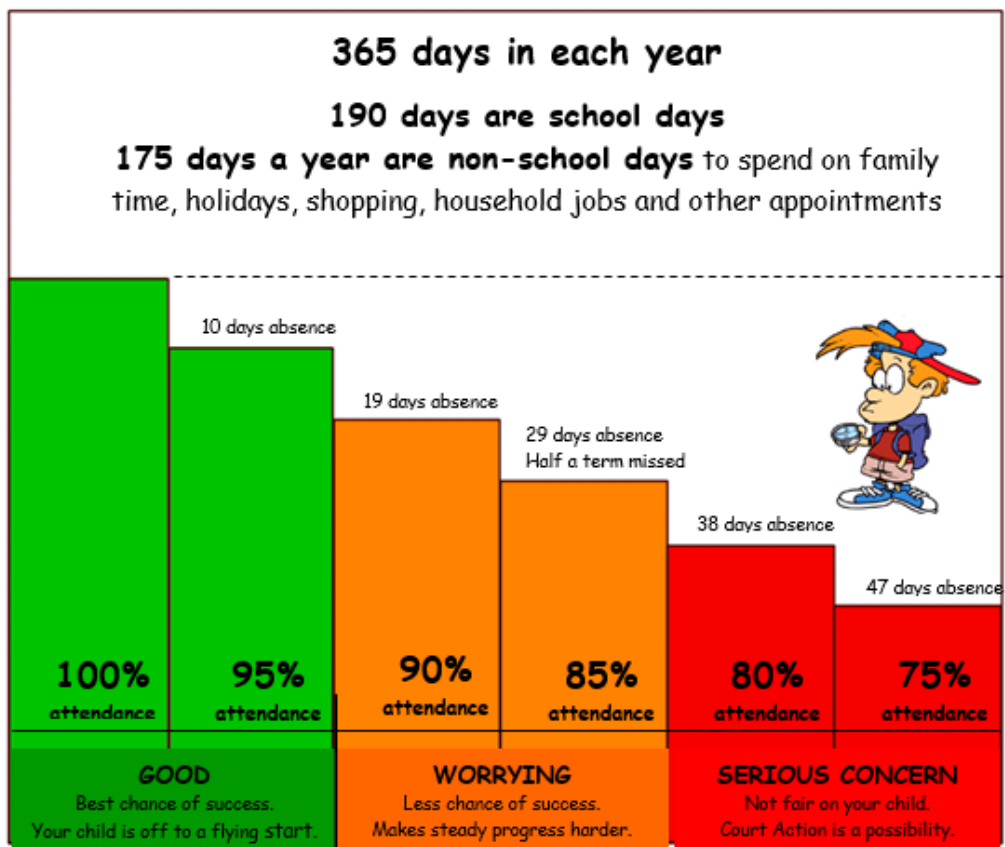

Class News

Last week we had a great time exploring the senses of looking and listening. Going for some fabulous walks, identifying the sounds we can hear, passing traffic, the school children playing, birds and even the water (in the stream). We saw our shadows, a church, some daffodils and some footprints from a dog and a duck. Making and listening to music, trying to guess which instrument makes what sound. This week we have had lots of fun playing and learning about how Chinese New Year is celebrated. We learned it is an important festival and this year is the year of the rabbit. We looked at some Chinese writing and had a go at copying some of it. We dressed up in traditional costume and listened to some Chinese music. We even tried Chinese food at snack time and had a go at using chop sticks. We practised saying Hello 'Ni Hao' in the Chinese language of Mandarin. The children loved learning about the celebratory dance called the Dragon dance, using our own dragon costume and dragon head that they had been making in Nursery during the week.

We have been finding out about how people celebrate Chinese New Year. We enjoyed listening to the story explaining how a group of animals had a race to decide how the years should be named. In PE we explored how the different animals would move on land and through the water during the race. We used words such as 'creep', 'slither', 'stride' and 'stomp' to describe our movements. In Maths, Year R have been exploring the number nine and Year 1 have been showing what they know about two-digit numbers. We have also been thinking about how people can use machines to communicate with each other and talked about similarities and differences between different telephones from the past. We enjoyed making slider mechanisms with curved slots to create pictures of a bird flying from a bird bath to a tree.




Robins	<p>Robins class have been exploring alliteration in English this week whilst retelling the story of 'The Sheep and the Goat', the children have been coming up with fantastic sentences using the same letter sound for the start of each word. Matilda came up with this; "The covered the cottage in cotton."</p> <p>In Maths the Year 1's have been dividing counters into equal groups and problem solving to see if all the numbers given could be divided equally. Then they have written their own division sentences. The Year 2's have been solving division word problems and have realised they can use prior knowledge of multiplication and doubles to help them work them out.</p> <p>In DT we have explored making a slider to have a moving part in our picture, the children said they found this tricky but loved it at the same time!</p> <p>In Geography we have been thinking about where the hot and cold climates are in the world and what typical weather would look like. We used Google Earth to explore each climate so we could compare similarities and differences.</p> <p>The music from the carnival of the animals has been the theme of our dance this term, as a class we created a hen and cockerel dance, listening to the music to make us think about the speed in which we would move.</p> <p>In Science we have been sorting and classifying pictures of reptiles, insects, mammals, fish and amphibians we then looked at what animals are carnivores, omnivores and herbivores.
