Goldcrests	With the excitement of frogspawn season, the children have been learning about the life cycle of a frog. How the tadpoles start as an egg (frog spawn) and hatch into tadpoles, then they will grow their 2 back legs first and then their two front legs, and slowly their tails will get shorter as their legs get stronger and then they are frogs.
