Class News

In keeping with our 'h' sound of the week, we looked at how we keep healthy by exercising using hula hoops, hopscotch and throwing and catching hoops. Discussing what we need to eat to stay healthy and what is a treat. Our story of the week Handa's Surprise explored tropical fruit and how we share and give gifts to our friends. During Forest School the children helped to hide the hedgehog house in a quiet place then create their own hedges out of natural resources. Back at Nursery we played the hedgehog game and coloured hedgehog pictures. We have been looking after babies and each other in our role-play hospital. Creating stories with our small world horses, practising our handwriting in the flour and matching the heart halves to their corresponding number or pattern. On Monday the children and parents had a lovely day showing off their physical skills at our annual Sports' Day. The children thoroughly enjoyed the track races, parachute and being able to show their ball skills whilst throwing and catching. On Tuesday the children were able to get close to nature whilst exploring newts, some even being brave enough to hold them in their hands. This week we have been concentrating on the letter sound 'n' in their different activities. Looking at how numbers are made up using smaller numbers to make bigger numbers. Some children have been working out how to add two numbers together. The water cascade and water trays have been a busy area in the warm weather as the children used nets to collect the correct coloured fish and transport water using jugs, syphons and test tubes, leading to the opportunity to talk about capacity.

This linked with our previous work on plants. Year One have completed some descriptive writing and made some observational drawings of young vegetable plants. We will be transferring all of our vegetables and tomato plants and watching them grow under our care. In Maths, Reception have been exploring capacity and odd and even numbers. Year One have been revisiting Class addition and subtraction. In Science we have been investigating garden and urban habitats. **Superstars** The children made their own town maps in groups and decided which creatures lived there. In Geography we have been learning about the human features of Australia, main cities and landmarks. We celebrated 'World Bee Day' and learnt how bees collect pollen and nectar and how honey is made. Over the last two weeks the Year 2 children have showed how calm and settled they have been when taking their SAT's tests, the children took them in their stride and even said they were fun! In Maths we have been making arrays with counters to represent 2 rows of 5 or 5 rows of 2. In English we have been writing lots of short burst stories and acting out and re-telling familiar stories. The children's acting has been fantastic! In Science we have been learning all about animal habitats and micro habitats in school. We went over to Forest School and made predictions as to what they might see under the logs. We did not expect to find a newt which the children thought was amazing. To end the week, we all enjoyed a 'now press play' experience about habitats. In Geography we have been locating and labelling Sydney on a map of Australia, the children found out all about aboriginal paintings and created their own, they also used art straws to make a picture of the Harbour Bridge and used Lego to build Sydney Tower and the Sydney Opera House. They were also excited to recreate Bondi beach using sand. This week was also Sports Day – what fun was had with the selection of activities for the children to take part in. In music we have been learning how to play notes B and A on the recorders. Have a lovely half term.
